Please read through these important Bowlers' Instructions:

Please begin by completing the registration form on the back of the brochure and mailing it with your registration fee to the YFC office (PO Box 3700, Wichita, KS 67201), or you can register online at www.yfcwichita.org. We need your registration by March 3rd. Next, using this sponsor sheet, ask your friends, family, neighbors, co-workers, etc. to sponsor you for either a flat fee, or a per-pin amount. **Each bowler should raise at least \$100 in pledges, and amounts of \$10 or less should be collected when pledged.** Remember that a per-pin pledge would be for 3 games of bowling. If you bowl an average of 100 per game you would have 300 pins to multiply by the sponsor's pledge (i.e. 300 pins X .10 pledge = \$30.00 total). **Make sure that all sponsor information is legibly completed for proper invoicing/receipting purposes.** **Please collect any pledges of \$10 or less ahead of time and bring them with you the day of the event.** You may also collect other pledges beforehand, or let us invoice your sponsors after the bowl-a-thon. Parent Life

Parent Life provides support, care and encouragement to pregnant teens, teen parents and their children. Many find themselves alone or misunderstood by friends and loved ones, having nowhere to turn. Parent Life can help put the pieces back together with just a little love, encouragement, care and guidance. We help them make good choices and establish a solid foundation, not only in their lives, but also in the lives of their babies. Parent Life seeks to engage these young people wherever they are found as life-long followers of Jesus Christ.

Juvenile Justice

Juvenile Justice is the ministry department of Youth for Christ that works with at-risk young people. We define an at-risk youth as a young person who has a significantly damaged life and will likely damage the lives of others. Staff work with youth that are incarcerated in the Sedgwick County juvenile facilities, and provide Chaplain services and activities like small group Bible studies, discussion groups, worship services and special events.

Campus Life

Campus Life ministry combines healthy relationships with creative programs to help senior high young people make good choices, establish a solid foundation for life, and positively impact their schools. Like all YFC ministries, it seeks to engage these young people as life-long followers of Jesus Christ. Campus Life provides a balanced approach - physical, mental, social and spiritual - to give teens the skills and hope they need to live in a turbulent world.

City Life

The purpose of City Life is to help young people develop attitudes and behavior patterns that allow them to function more constructively in society. The City Life program emphasizes the following: 1) Teaching basic life skills. 2) Providing an opportunity for a relationship with a caring adult role model. 3) Promoting and developing positive self-image through Jesus Christ. 4) Creating opportunities for positive peer group experiences. 5) Sharing the Good News of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. City Life meets students through classes at McAdams Academy, and community service.
